LAST CHANCE TO HAVE YOUR SAY!

Along with our community, we've been creating a blueprint for the future of Ōtorohanga Town and we've finished the draft Ōtorohanga Town Concept Plan. We're keen to hear whether you think we've got it right! A huge thank you to everyone who came along to the Drop-In Session last weekend to share their thoughts on the draft plan. Your opinions are appreciated and will be considered when the Plan is finalised.

I couldn't make the session – can I still give feedback?

Yes! Just head to our website (<https://www.otodc.govt.nz/town-concept-plan>) or follow the QR code above and fill out the form. Use the form to tell us if you agree with the draft or if you think something needs changing and why. You have until **Sunday, August 15** to share your opinions. And if you wish to speak about your submission to Council at a formal meeting called a hearing you can do that too.

What happens next?

Once we've received community feedback, including those speaking at the hearing, Council will consider what changes need to be made to the Draft Plan. The final Plan gets presented to Council in September for formal adoption. And then we'll put the Plan into action!

MANIAPOTO STREET WATER MAINS RENEWAL

Wondering what's going on in Maniapoto Street? We're renewing the water mains to ensure that we can meet the growing demand for our town and continue to provide uninterrupted water year-round. So, although the project is temporarily disruptive, it is vital to the future development of our town. Traffic management is in place to keep vehicles and pedestrians safe. We expect that it will take up to a month to complete the work and we appreciate your understanding and patience while this happens. Keen to find out more? They'll start in Ōtorohanga in September, then head to Kāwhia and Tihiroa in October and November. Watch out for updates on the dates and locations closest to you.

WHY SHOULD I VOTE IN LOCAL GOVERNMENT ELECTIONS?

Some people think there's no reason to vote in local government elections, after all, what does Council do? But they're wrong!

There's no level of government in Aotearoa that is more directly involved in the day-to-day happenings within our local community, than our Council. Think about your local roads, parks and playgrounds, where your poo goes and how safe your drinking water is, libraries, swimming pool, how safe buildings are, and ensuring food premises are operating safely, to name a few. These are just some of the things that Council takes care of.

The mayor, councillors, and local board members make decisions that have an impact on many aspects of our lives and our local community. So, it's a good idea to pay attention to local elections, find out about the aspirations and ideas of candidates, and VOTE for the people you think best represent you and the things you care about. You don't have to own property or a house to vote. If you live in the district and are enrolled in the district then you can VOTE and have a say in the future of the district! Head to **vote.nz** to make sure you're enrolled to vote and get out and vote in your local government elections! This opportunity only happens once every three years!
