
## **ÖTOROHANGA DISTRICT COUNCIL**RATES

## BETTER OFF FUNDING - \$2.66 MILLION SECURED BY COUNCIL

Ōtorohanga District Council is delighted to have secured \$2.66 million from the Better Off Fund. Funding is from Central Government's \$2 billion fund for councils nationally to invest in their communities as they transition out of delivering 3 Waters (stormwater, wastewater, drinking water) and increase focus on wellbeing, climate resilience and community development.

Priority projects were decided on through wānanga/ workshop involving councillors, community board chairs, Iwi leaders, and representatives from the Ōtorohanga District Development Board, decided on by dot democracy vote.

The four priority projects are:

- Enhance Ōtorohanga College \$1,640,000
- Ōtorohanga Ora \$130,000
- Tōkihi Phase One \$100,000
- Seawall Kāwhia Defence \$730,000 Staff administration costs of \$60,000

#### Total \$2,660,000
