We have seen a significant increase in our rural recycling centres being misused. The overloading of bins and the dumping of rubbish has been causing major issues for our contractor, and if the issue continues, we will have to seriously consider the viability of these centres moving forward. The illegal dumping rubbish or "fly tipping" carries a potential infringement fee of \$400, this applies to using the rural recycling centres as a rubbish dump.
