**MEETING** at Cambridge on the 21<sup>st</sup> day of October 2016

**THE APPLICATION**

The Otorohanga District Licensing Committee has before it an application by Kawhia Sports Club an *on-site* special licence pursuant to section 137 of the Act.

The events leading to this application are to be held at Rosamond Terrace, Kawhia and can be summarised as follows:

1. A 50<sup>th</sup> birthday party on Saturday 12 November 2016 from 5p.m. to 12 midnight for up to 100 people of various ages.
2. A 80<sup>th</sup> birthday party on Saturday 19 November 2016 from 5p.m. to 12 midnight for up to 100 people of various ages.

*The events are not considered to be a large scale event in accordance with section 143 of the Act.*

**DECISION OF THE COMMITTEE**

No objections have been filed in respect to this application pursuant to section 140 of the Act, and it is therefore determined on the papers by the Chairperson alone in accordance with section 191(2) of the Act.

Reports have been received from the Police, the Medical Officer of Health and a Licensing Inspector. No concerns have been raised in respect to the criteria outlined in section 142 of the Act.

There is no information to question the applicants suitability, and it is felt they have appropriate systems, staff and training in place to comply with the law. This, combined with the design of the intended premises, and the availability of food, low and non-alcoholic beverages leads to the conclusion that there is unlikely to be any negative effect on the amenity and good order of the area, and that ultimately the application satisfies the object of the Act.

However, in order to ensure that is the case a number of conditons have been recommended in respect to the application. Namely:

- a) Alcohol sold/supplied to the following types of people: Those attending the functions above only.
- b) The fees payable for the licence concerned are: \$63.25
- c) Steps to ensure that the provisions of this Act relating to the sale and supply of alcohol to prohibited persons.
- d) Steps to ensure that the provisions of this Act relating to the management of premises.
- e) **Drinking water must be freely available at the following places while the premises are open for business:** The bar and on the tables.
- f) Food must be as follows:  
pies, pizzas, sandwiches, salads, cakes, desserts, fish, seafood or similar provided at each event.
- g) Low alcohol beverages must be available as follows: Light Ice and 2.5% Tui.
- h) Non-alcohol beverages must be available as follows: tea, coffee, juice, water and soft drinks.
- i) Provide assistance with or information about alternative forms of transport from the premises.
- j) Duty manager to be on site when alcohol is for sale.

Having due regard to the application and the reports received, the application is hereby approved, subject to the above conditions. The special licence may be issued immediately, and shall remain in force until the conclusion of the final event as detailed in condition a0 above.
